

Parent/Carer Satisfaction Survey 2024

The survey was produced in a digital format within Survey Monkey. It was shared at the January Parents' Evening which took place both in person and online. The survey link was emailed to parents/carers twice and displayed in school via a QR code. The school office actively prompted parents/carers to complete the survey when attending the Parents' Evening, as well as those who visited the school for other reasons. There were 17 responses during the 2-week period in which the survey was open.

The core survey included 21 questions which are based on the Ofsted Parent View questionnaire. Parents/Carers were asked to score the statements below based on the following Key: (if the statement does not apply to your child, please select N/A)

- 1 = Absolutely Agree
- 2 = Agree
- 3 = Disagree
- 4 = Completely Disagree



Do you believe that the school website is a useful resource?





Please, encourage *Pupil Name* for more reading.... Reading- is knowledge, knowledge-is success... The OT and speech and language therapy, I didn't have a chance to meet those teachers, but I believe that the program for *Pupil Name* is well tailored. Please make a stress on developing *Pupil Name*'s left hand, also would be great if there would be some reminders for *Pupil Name* to walk straight, to not to push her posture in front, just to keep her back straight while walking. Her left eye is not functioning, so she has to be sitting accordingly in order to see all information and events. The way she talks, please ask her always to not to speak quickly, so her speech will be more clear and easy for others to understand. Self care and self hygiene is still also an issue, I discussed it with Ms Hirani, so she will act accordingly. Summary of parents/carers answers:

Across the survey, parents/carers provided extremely positive feedback to the school, with 100% of parents responding positively to 15 out of the 21 questions.

In the core survey, the highest scoring questions were:

- The school encourages good attendance 100% strongly agree.
- The school site is safe 100% agree, (94% strongly agree).
- When I contact the school, the staff are helpful and approachable 100% agree, (94% strongly agree).
- My child benefits from the positive behaviour policy and enjoys getting merits 100% agree, (94% strongly agree).


The lowest scoring question (disagree) was:

• My child receives relevant and regular homework – 82% agree. 3 parents disagreed, but no one strongly disagreed.

This was the only question where more than one parent disagreed with the statement. There were however 5 other questions where one parent disagreed with the statements. School will explore these on an individual basis.

100% of parents agreed that the school runs a useful breakfast club and that the school provides a healthy and mixed menu for school dinners.


How did parents reflect on the aspects of school they most value?



Parent and carer feedback was very positive, with regular reference to a high standard of academic focus and supportive, respectful staff. Pupil independence and social skills were identified as an important part of the school's offer and the word safe was commonly used too.



How did parents/carers reflect on what they would like to see the school do school to improve the quality of education?



The key themes within this question were regarding reading and homework. A number of respondents highly value these areas and there is more the school can do to improve these areas or better communicate our actions. 2 parents referred to Speech and Language Therapy and Occupational Therapy. These are areas the school has made strong progress in but recognise there has been a shortfall in service due to these teams being unable to recruit to posts.

Actions:

- Follow up with one parent that disagreed that school deal well with complaints and problems and explore concerns.
- Invite parents to a Parent Reference Group regarding homework in March. What would they be keen to see?
- Inform parents of the school's new 'Reading for Pleasure' programme, including reading at home, phonics, and a drive to embrace reading as a fun pastime. Ensure parents/carers are invited to the book fair at the end of the spring term.
- Ensure SaLT and OT share any challenges in service delivery with parents/carers alongside regular positive updates, e.g. that all SaLT recruitment has been completed and there is a full complement of therapists.
