

# How do I choose?

- Think about your strengths and subjects you are best at, but also what you enjoy.
- It is ok to be aspirational when choosing a course for next year, but you must be realistic too.
- If you are struggling to choose ask us for advice, we can help you choose the right subject and course .
- You can also ask your teacher what your predicted grade is in that subject area, as well as English and Maths as this will support you in making a decision.
- Don't worry that you don't know your predicted grades yet, that is normal!
- Formal predicted grades from school will be complete in early November.



## Entry requirements

- Colleges will have their own entry requirements, many are different depending on the course. It is a great starting point to look at this before choosing a course.
- There are many options available at a range of colleges, use the pathway guide to help you look at what is available to you.

### Sixth Form

 Schools that have sixth forms are also an option, these are not always best suited to our pupils. This type of provision is usually aimed at pupils working towards the Level 2/3 Pathway or A-Levels.

### **Apprenticeships**

• These can be an excellent pathway for pupils wanting to take a vocational route. At 16 these at aimed at more Fast-track pupils. At 18 there are much wider opportunities in some fantastic industries.

### **Internships**

• These are very similar to work experience placements. They are usually short term and unpaid but often valuable experiences and insights to the world of work.





There are two parts to the process. Part 1:

- Your application to the college/sixth form. This is done through the college/sixth form website.
- For the college to start the process, this needs to be started as soon as possible. Don't Panic! It is really easy.....

E.g. You can Google 'West London College application for.....'



- The best form of application is through the college website.
- By applying this way, your information goes straight in to the database.
- You can also apply using a paper copy, which are usually in each prospectus.

- Part 2:
- Your local authority consultation will take place in the next few months.
- The LA will look at your preferences (in the AR or they may ask you directly) and will send the EHCP and any relevant info to your preferred placement. We will also happily advise you.
- The SENDCO of the provision will usually be the one to make a decision based on the paperwork.



The EHCP annual review is a really important point for all of us.

- Make your preference for next year very clear as this will be shared with the local authority.
- Working with staff we must ensure the EHCP considers the skills needed for the preferred course and references the pupil's interests so there is a clear link between the pupil's preference and the course.
- Ensure you engage in the process to help remove any 'old' information, particularly things that pupils can now do/cannot do..
   You can request support from a parent

You can request support from a parent support network. They are specific to your borough.



- Visit! In the next few weeks and months.
- Apply! The sooner the better!
- Apply to as many colleges as you want, you can always turn some offers down later.
- Make sure you tell school/LA about your applications and ask if you require any support with this process. We are happy to support/complete applications in school.








- Visit placements as soon as possible.
- Pick a course that is suitable. It is okay to be aspirational but be realistic too.
- Don't wait to apply, send application forms in as soon as you're happy.
- Attend interviews, assessments.
- Don't worry if a college says no, another college might say yes, or a different course may be more appropriate.
- Ensure you are happy with the EHCP this year, it is important in getting you on to the right course.

Ask any questions you have. We are here for you.

## **College Experience**

- Each year, we prepare the pupils for leaving Woodlane by taking the pupils to a college for 1 day per week in the academic year.
- We currently have a college link with WLC and WMSF. This commences fully tomorrow, pupils have received letters with information.
- We have a number of pupils who require different access arrangements and who will benefit from experiencing different settings.



- Usually takes place in February.
- We work with H&F to find suitable placements based on pupil interests.
- We welcome parents organising 'own find' placements too.
- Miss Blinco & Debbie work closely with the pupils to support them in finding appropriate placements.

## **Supporting with Qualifications**

### Supporting all subjects:

- Practise past exam papers. This will greatly benefit students. Find the correct exam board on the following information sheets and include that in a Google search for GCSE Past Papers.
- The BBC Bitesize website contains a wide range of information on all GCSE subjects. Students can complete practice quizzes and use the study guides.
- Plan, prepare and discuss the exams with your child. Exam anxiety is normal and there are many ways to help with this. Have a look at some of the attached information packs to get some ideas about preparing and revising.
- Most students will receive 25% extra time for each of their GCSE exams. Students are tested by the examinations boards and anyone who qualifies for further support, i.e. a reader, a scribe, etc, will have that support applied for and if appropriate supplied.
- Create a homework and revision schedule with your child. Plan for time each night to do set homework or work through any of the exam support listed on the following pages. We have homework club Monday, Wednesday, Friday at lunchtime in the humanities room.
