
Executive Summary


Summer 2017/18 Headline Results:

- A The % of pupils who met and exceeded their expectations rose by 0.2% year on year to 99.08%.
- A Over 92% of pupils met yearly extension targets, a rise of 2.3% year on year.
- ▲ The progress of ethnicity groups, including the three largest (WBRI, BAFR & BCRB) is outstanding.
- In the core subjects there is no gap in progress between PP and those not in receipt.

Substantial Progress: Woodlane High School has analysed the progress of all pupils in all subjects throughout the academic year 2017/18 and **progress is outstanding**. This is because the vast majority of pupils progress well from their different starting points and achieve or exceed standards expected within the school's own curriculum. 99.08% of pupil expectations are being met or exceeded, with 57.97% of expectations exceeded. Both of these headline figures are above the school's target of 97% and 50%.



Sustained Progress: Progress at Woodlane continues on an upward trend when historic data in **all subjects** is explored from 2015/16 – 2017/2018. Pupils make substantial and sustained progress, developing excellent knowledge, understanding and skills, considering their different starting points.





Both English and Maths achieved over 99%, whilst Science is rapidly closing the gap on English and Maths. The proportion exceeding expectations was also over 50% in each of the core subjects.

Within the foundation subjects, the progress of all pupils is broadly similar, with subjects ranging from 100% to 95% meeting and exceeding expectations.



Analysis of Common Groups: Woodlane analyses the progress of all pupils by groups within English, Maths and Science, including; Gender, SEN, Ethnicity and Pupil Premium. The tables below show the largest groups within the school compared to each other. Analysis of additional target groups can be read within the full Autumn Term Progress Report. There is some variation in the progress of pupils based on their grouping, but gaps in progress are small, contributing to an outstanding judgement overall.
